1. Introduction

1. Occupation overview

Adventure tourism is a type of tourism, involving exploration or travel with perceived (and possibly actual) risk, and potentially requiring specialized skills and physical exertion. Adventure tourism has grown in recent decades, as tourists seek different kinds of vacations, but measurement of market size and growth is hampered by the lack of a clear operational definition. Adventure tourism as an accumulation of several characteristics such as remote and exotic natural environment, challenging and adventurous activities, mental and physical toughness, risky endeavor's, specialised skills and equipment's, guided tours and product commercialisation.

Adventure tourism has emerged as one of the fastest growing nature-based tourism industry worldwide. This scenario, among others is mainly due to the paradigm shift in contemporary adventure-lovers' demand, expectation and psychological belief, whereby enjoyment through experiencing the natural environment or 'statically' involve in nature-based experiences within their own usual surroundings are no longer sufficient. In recent years, adventure tourism in Malaysia has stand out to be one of the most prevalent for nature-based tourism and increasingly dominates the industry.

An adventure tour guide with a general knowledge of a variety of skill competencies (i.e. interpretive, medical and sustainability) required to facilitate a group of clients through a range of terrains, environments and locales in a safe, manageable and respectable manner. Guides work for adventure tourism companies, resorts, parks, lodges or campgrounds, or they operate their own small businesses. They facilitate the opportunity to experience a diverse range of activities, depending on the season and on their skills. An adventure tour guide must have a tolerance for adversity and uncertainty. They should possess a strong sense of self-awareness and be able to exercise sound judgment and decision making. An adventure travel guide is highly flexible and has strong communication skills (sometimes involving multiple languages.

The demands for qualified and experienced Adventure Tour Guide are presently high and may increase in the near future. Thus, the development of this NOSS is essential for the industry to have certain guidelines and standards based on the level of competencies that has been set by the industrial experts in this field.

This NOSS is developed in response to the request made by the industry to produce Adventure Tour Guide. For those participant interested to join this training program is recommended physically and mentally fit.

- ii. Open water safety and rescue certificate from recognized bodies for marine and flat-water or
- iii. Swift water safety and rescue certificate from recognized bodies for whitewater river

4. Definition of Competency Levels

The NOSS is developed for various occupational areas. Candidates for certification must be assessed and trained at certain levels to substantiate competencies. Below is a guideline of each NOSS Level as defined by the Department of Skills Development, Ministry of Human Resources, Malaysia.

Level 1: Competent in performing a range of varied work activities, most of which are routine and predictable.

Level 2: Competent in performing a significant range of varied work activities, performed in a variety of contexts. Some of the activities are non-routine and required individual responsibility and autonomy.

Level 3: Competent in performing a broad range of varied work activities, performed in a variety of contexts, most of which are complex and non-routine. There is considerable responsibility and autonomy and control or guidance of others is often required.

Level 4: Competent in performing a broad range of complex technical or professional work activities performed in a wide variety of contexts and with a substantial degree of personal responsibility and autonomy. Responsibility for the work of others and allocation of resources is often present.

Level 5: Competent in applying a significant range of fundamental principles and complex techniques across a wide and often unpredictable variety of contexts. Very substantial personal autonomy and often significant responsibility for the work of others and for the allocation of substantial resources features strongly, as do personal accountabilities for analysis, diagnosis, planning, execution and evaluation.

The Director General shall award, to any person upon completing successfully the NOSS program following skills level qualifications as stipulated under the National Skills Development Act, 652:

Water-Based Adventure Tour Guiding personnel are designated to handle water-based adventure tour and activities to ensure the tourists are handled professionally. As water-based adventure tour guiding job area is customer oriented industry, the personnel need to have effective communication skills, product knowledge and positive attitude to deal with various customers' behaviour and background. They must be prepared to work at odd hours, challenging and adventurous activity. Fluency in many languages is added value for water-based adventure tour guiding personnel that will ensure their sustainability in this job area.
